# From the Superintendent's desk...

Dear Parents, Guardians and Community Members,

First Day of School
August 24, 2017 Looking back, Joliet Public School had a great year. Stakeholder generosity manifested itself in a variety of ways: continued volunteerism, participation in the climate survey, passing of a technology levy, continued 'likes' on our Facebook page, improved attendance at board meetings, cooperation for teacher collaboration during early releases, expressed interest in a Parent Group (whose name is yet to be determined) and wonderful attendance at various extra-curricular events. Though conflicts periodically arose, the achievements resulting from the singular direction of the educational community made the beautiful struggle all worthwhile. The result of your help and of many things done well acted as the catalyst for growth and positive change. Thanks for all the assistance over the course of the year.

One of the many accomplishments this year was the implementation of the Montana Behavioral Initiative (MBI), which is a proactive approach to creating behavioral supports and a social culture that establishes social, emotional, and academic success for all students. MBI is an organized, data-driven system of interventions, strategies, and supports that positively impact school-wide and individualized behavior planning (OPI website). Joliet's approach, in the first year of implementation, was "J-Hawks SOAR". We're "Safe and Welcoming,  $\underline{\mathbf{O}}$  rganized,  $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$  ccountable,  $\underline{\mathbf{R}}$  espectful and Responsible". We attained bronze status from The State after our on-site survey, which is, apparently, no easy feat. Thank you J-Hawk staff, students and community for taking this implementation seriously. We hope to generate more fervor in the middle and high school as we advance into the second year of implementation. The school will keep you apprised of our coordinated efforts throughout the year.

Another huge gain for the school was the new science curriculum K-12. The teachers, led by our newest administrator Ms. Darlene Hartman, started the textbook adoption process with the staff in February. The criteria for adoption included alignment to Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS), Scope and Sequence, critical thinking/problem-solving activities, technology integration, project-based learning, online access, studentfriendly materials, Lexile Levels and differentiation. The Joliet Trustees supported the process by approving the adoption of new science materials at the June board meeting. The staff and students can look forward to updated, rigorous and interesting science materials this year and in years to come.

The district also attained more data from MAP and SBAC testing. We had more comprehensive assessments for consideration, which aided a committee in creating a Gifted And Talented Education (GATE) program in the elementary school for grades 3-6. The GATE Committee compiled data from various tests, read referrals, and evaluated students using a matrix designed by the GATE Committee. After the selection process, students embarked on Passion Projects and had fun engaging with their intellectual peers once a week during a pull-out

The enhanced data helped all students, regardless of where they fell on the learning spectrum. The new web-based testing sites are extensive enough that teachers can build learner plans and personalize goals for each student. Utilizing more information, the district met individual learner needs and closed achievement gaps better than ever before. Thank you for supporting these tests. Your support for these academic endeavors matters tremendously simply because parent and family engagement positively influences student learning. In fact, multiple studies show that the effort put forth by parents and guardians (reading stories aloud, checking homework, discussing school activities at home, and meeting with teachers) has a bigger impact on children's educational achievement than most other factors scientifically examined. In partnership with families, the Joliet School continues to create more confident people as each student transitions into the workforce with adequate skills for success. Thank you for enduring the testing. It's not fun, but it is important.

With the passage of the technology levy and with new carpet installation after asbestos abatement, there are facility improvements to tangibly appreciate. Moreover, the professional team of educators, who endeavor through hard work, perseverance and creativity, create an educational community worth supporting. Please come to see the palpable changes and to interact with our team. Seeing one another face-to-face is a critical aspect of keeping our partnership strong, and it gives me the opportunity to say "thank you" in person. Until then, be safe as you pack your summer itinerary with lots of seasonal fun. We'll see you soon!

# **INSURANCE**

# JOLIET PUBLIC SCHOOLS CARRIES SUPPLEMENTAL INSURANCE FROM NORTHWESTERN SCHOLASTIC INSURANCE

Forms are available from Mrs. Williams at the District Office. This insurance covers students: a) attending regular school sessions, b) participating in sponsored interscholastic sports, c) participating in school sponsored extracurricular activities, and d) traveling directly to and from school for regular school sessions and to and from school sponsored extracurricular activities while under the supervision of a school employee. This is a secondary insurance and has limited coverage.

# **MEDICINES**

Please return the form for "Self Administration of Medication in Schools" to Mrs. Williams' office. All medications, including overthe-counter medications must remain in the original packaging and cannot be administered without this form on file at the office. ALL medications should be turned into the office, with the exception of asthmatic students who keep their inhalers with them for immediate use. Medicines must not be kept in lockers or backpacks. This policy is in place for the safety of your children.




