From the Superintendent's desk...

Hello Joliet Families, Staff and Community Members!

I write to you today from a stronger, more efficient and more competitive school district.

During the past year, Joliet High School won the Distinguished Schools Award, which is a National award recognizing federally funded schools for their outstanding academic achievements. We also concluded year two of a five-year technology levy, which permitted more technological advances school wide. In addition to the tech levy, and with the continued generosity of stakeholders, we passed a building reserve levy this year. This building reserve levy will allow us to work on long-overdue facility projects. Many thanks to those who voted favorably and persist in their unwavering commitment to our core values as a community. The students continue to benefit from improvements prioritized by big-hearted constituents. Thank you!

Another exciting award Joliet High School received was the Aim Higher Award. During the MHSA Annual Meeting this year, Joliet was the only school recognized for their continued participation. The Aim Higher Program began in 1989 and focuses on leadership, mentoring, making correct choices and sportsmanship. MHSA made a video about Joliet School and presented the video in open forum, along with a plaque. The District sustains and prioritizes leadership for our student body through intentional means, as is evidenced by nods of excellence from reputable organizations like MHSA.

While receiving evidence of high standards in academics and extra-curricular activities, we sustained a focus on safety. The Safety Committee identified more areas in need of risk mitigation, and, as a result, we incorporated reasonable security / emergency preparedness measures. The entire staff completed a full day of active shooter training, the District installed safety film on another bank of windows and all main entrances, and we purchased trauma treatment kits placed strategically around the school. Additionally, we conducted several drills and discussed the communication aspects as they relate to policies, procedures and systems. To help foster an environment of inclusion and acceptance for all students, we also created an online bullying form. In conjunction with the Joliet staff and Board of Trustees, the Safety Committee continues to work on expectations of safety and the prevention of negative incidents on campus. It is powerful work completed by empowered people as we strive to keep our kids safe.

A large part of school safety stems from creating an emotionally safe environment. OPI was most impressed with our student mentoring program newly developed last year. The District-wide program manifested itself from MBI team efforts and engages our students in activities to strengthen peer-to-peer communication. High school students meet weekly with their mentoring buddy, and embark on quality time. The Joliet Mentoring Program aligns well with MBI/MTSS framework. Though the State's Montana Behavior Initiative (MBI) is morphing into Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS), the ideas remain intact. This framework ensures that ALL students at Joliet Public School are provided with high quality instruction and interventions that are evidence based. MTSS ensures that students' academic and social-emotional/behavioral needs are met, while their personal growth, their motivation, their connection, and their resilience are improved within a safe and supportive learning environment. We continue to SOAR with the assistance of the MTSS Student Team and MTSS Committee (J-Hawks are §afe and welcoming, Organized, Accountable and Responsible and

Overall, we have acted deliberately to improve our academic performance with prudent decision making, and have laid more foundation for programs conducive to making us a greater organization. The responsible operations have kept us healthy, and we are looking forward to another spectacular year. Enjoy the rest of summer, and we'll see you at the barbeque during our annual open house.

From Mr. Begger...

The 2018 - 2019 school year was a great success. After just a few days on the job as the Elementary Principal, it became obvious that there are substantial efforts being made towards creating a positive climate and culture for students, staff, and community members.

On the first day of school, and throughout the year, I was greeted by happy students, smiling faces, please, thank you, door holding, removing of hats, and a host of other great mannerisms. These traits are evidence of the strong family support structures in place here in the community. Please keep up the good work.

When it comes to overall education environment, we are always looking to get better. With this in mind, there are a couple of changes to the educational program of which you should be aware.

The first change will be the increased integration of 6th grade into the junior high school. One reason for this change is to introduce 6th graders to the bell schedule and moving between classes within a small window of time. Keeping with tradition, 6th graders will be split into two groups and have two primary teachers. These teachers will instruct the core academic areas of Math, Science, English Language Arts, and Social Studies. With that said, 6th grade will, for the most part, transition between these core subjects and teachers with the middle school bell schedule. We find that 7th graders often struggle with the transition into 7th grade as a result of juggling classes and more teachers. This move is intended to curb those challenges.

Another change will be the adoption of standards based grading from 3rd through 6th grade. Students and parents in those grades will no longer see traditional letter grades. Instead, students and parents will see their progress toward a specific educational standard like, "write narratives in which they recount a short sequence of events." Or, "demonstrate command of the conventions of standard English grammar." The purpose behind this shift is to communicate to students and parents progress towards specific skills that classroom instructors are teaching. We believe this targeted reporting helps students focus their learning so improvement can be made. The traditional letter grading system is vague and doesn't specify growth areas. This past year, Kindergarten through 2nd grade reported progress to students and parents with a standards based mindset. Please plan to attend a presentation on standards based grading during orientation in the fall.

I look forward to working with the students, parents, and community members of Joliet in the coming school year.


